The facade is the face of a building — Tonwerk brick-slips give this face expression, durability and a unique character — **100% Made in Germany.**

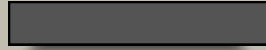
Besides color and surface, the chosen format is a central design element. It determines the proportions, visual impact, and character of a wall surface.



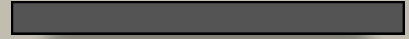
DF | THIN FORMAT

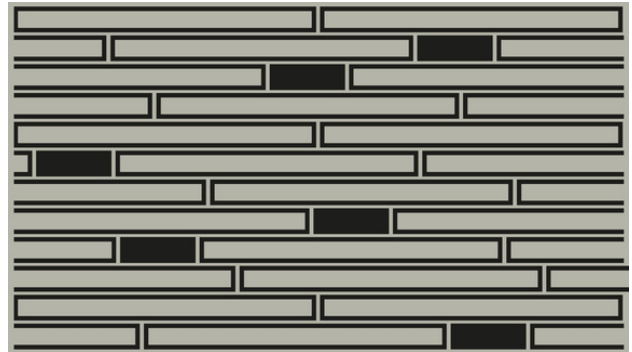
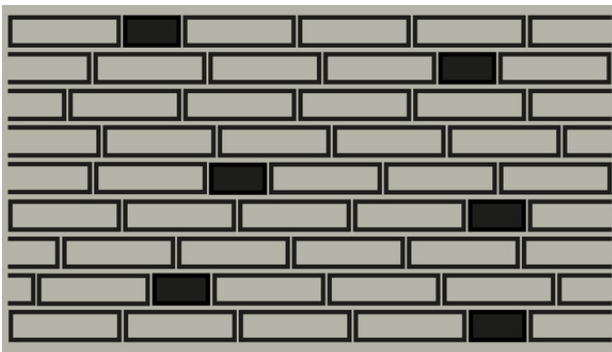

Due to the diverse formats, Tonwerk brick slips can be laid in various bond patterns.

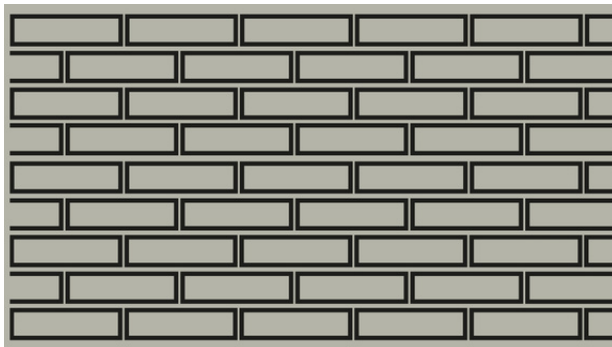
This gives facades their own unique rhythm: calm and uniform, dynamically textured, or minimalist.

RANDOM BOND



The random bond is a deliberately irregular laying pattern that gives facades a naturally lively, handcrafted appearance. The use of “headers” (also called “bonders”) is usually achieved by manually cutting individual brick slips to half their length.

STRETCHER BOND



The stretcher bond is the most commonly used masonry pattern and has shaped the appearance of facades worldwide for centuries. In the stretcher bond, all brick slips are laid in horizontal rows, with the vertical joints offset by half, one-third or one-quarter of the brick slip length. This creates a calm, harmonious joint pattern.
